SUMMARY: Volunteers in Cádiz make small reparation in the homes of elders affected by reduced mobility and with few economic resources. It is the initiative 'Botched Jobs without Frontiers', a project in which more than 20 volunteers of the province of Cádiz participate offering this service for free. Although their work is related to construction, they do not dedicate professionally to this job. A very important part of their visit is making company to these elders.
